Important Change – New Degree Requirement as of January 1, 2011

As of January 1, 2011, CHRP Candidates – those who have passed the National Knowledge Exam™ (NKE) - will require a minimum of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in order to register for the National Professional Practice Assessment™ (NPPA) and qualify for the CHRP designation.

Why?

The Canadian Council of Human Resources Associations and its member provincial associations are working to raise the standards of the HR profession. An important part of our mission is to ensure current and future members are well prepared to meet the needs of business.
